Marine Vinyl is a new type of vinyl coated fabric with a look that emulates a woven textile. Marine Vinyl has been designed for a broad range of applications from contract interior seating to marine upholstery and other outdoor environments.

APPLICATION & PERFORMANCE

Marine Vinyl is a superior performance vinyl designed for upholstery use in marine, indoor, and outdoor applications that require superior strength and durability. Marine Vinyl meets and exceeds requirements for outdoor applications, including UV resistance, bacterial resistance, mildew resistance, and low temperature flexibility. Marine Vinyl fabrics have a protective finish that offers outstanding stain and chemical resistance. Marine Vinyl offers both great design and performance and can be used in many interior and exterior applications on land and at sea. Both Marine Vinyl patterns are IMO certified, 7226 – Mast passes IMO PART 8 3.1 & 3.2 and 7227- Maritime passes IMO PART 8 3.1.

CARE & CLEANING

Day-to-Day Cleaning — To keep your Marine Vinyl looking great, it is recommended that a regular cleaning schedule be maintained. Spills and stains should be cleaned up as soon as they appear. Ordinary dirt, smudges, and water-soluble stains such as coffee, tea, juice, soft drinks, milk, beer, and wine can be removed with mild soap and water. Use a clean cloth or soft sponge to gently wipe the stain with soapy water. Don't stop there – it's really important to remove any remaining soap solution by wiping the area with a cloth and clean water, and finally to dry the surface with a soft lint-free cloth or towel. Avoid cleaners containing abrasives, as these can damage the product's coating. A 10:1 ratio of water to bleach solution may be used as a disinfectant. Rinse the surface with clean water after disinfecting. Dry with a soft, lint-free cloth or towel.

Stain Removal — Although these fabrics are resistant to most common stains, the dyes and pigments in some staining agents can create a permanent stain if not treated properly. To clean difficult stains from the upholstery, use a household cleaner such as Formula 409® All-Purpose Spray Cleaner, Clorox Disinfecting Wipes, or Lysol Multi-Purpose Cleaner. After cleaning, rinse the area with fresh water then dry with a clean, lint-free cloth.

Stubborn Stains — If a ghost stain remains, use a solvent-type cleaner, such as rubbing alcohol (isopropyl alcohol-91%). Rinse the cleaned area with fresh water then dry with a clean, lint-free cloth.
